Free home fire-safety inspections

Capital City Fire and Rescue has teamed up with FEMA and the state fire marshal's office to provide free home fire-safety inspections. These inspections are not for enforcement or code compliance but to make homes in Juneau safer. We are no longer just dropping a smoke detector off at your door.

We will come to your residence and in about one hour we will help you identify hazards in your home and provide recommendations to mediate the problems. We will also provide and install smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, fire extinguishers, kitchen-hood-vent extinguishers for stovetop fires, emergency escape ladders, kitchen timers and an Alaska-made home escape educational video.

Our target audience will be homes with children under 14 and elders over 65. National statistics show these groups are at highest risk of becoming trapped by fire.

At this time we have supplies for approximately 100 homes. Spaces are filling up fast, call for your appointment early.

If you would like to set up an inspection, please contact the fire department at 586-5322 and provide your name and phone number and one of our inspectors will contact you to make an appointment. If you have any questions on this program please contact Fire Marshal Rich Etheridge at 586-5322.

Packages for soldiers

Want to send a simple, heartfelt letter or care package to any soldier in harm's way, but have no idea of what to send, who to send it to, or how to send it? I just found a terrific web site: www.anysoldier.com. They've organized a database of contacts on a "Where to Send" page. Soldiers list what they need and want. You can read through the names and requests of individual soldiers and select the ones you wish to support. They even have a search capability so you can identify who has asked for the items you'd like to send. You address your letter or care package to the volunteer soldier listed on the page, they see the "ATTN: Any Soldier" line in the address, and put your letters and packages into the hands of soldiers who don't get much or any mail.

We sent packages of stationery and snacks. It's easy and heartwarming.
